





Jay Anthony, Jane Crosby Dever & SCP Health Honored at Garnet Health Foundation Gratitude Reception

Commitment to our patients, philanthropy, and mission were all themes at the annual Gratitude Reception, hosted on April 11, 2024 for the donors of the Garnet Health Foundation.

Jay Anthony of Middletown, NY received the Leadership in Philanthropy Award for 13 years of service, during which he led fundraising campaigns amidst the COVID-19 pandemic and spearheaded planning for the expansion of Garnet Health Medical Center's emergency department. Anthony was presented with an official "board chair" for his service.

"I believe there is no other charity who touches as many lives as our hospital. The number of patients and families who seek our care is extraordinary," said Anthony.

"We see 75,000 patients in our ER annually, another 25,000 as inpatients, and 241,000 patients through our Garnet Health Doctors' offices. Our medical personnel also performed 17,000 surgeries and procedures and handled another 51,000 visits at our Urgent Care facilities. It's really true: your gift — large or small — impacts many."

Garnet Health Foundation Vice Chair Tonia Crown thanked Anthony for his years of role modeling during the toughest of times and said how proud she was of her board

colleagues, as well as the new oncoming class of board members.

Jane Crosby Dever of Florida, NY a 43-year employee, received the Volunteer in Philanthropy Award for her support of fundraising events across the Garnet Health System. SCP Health, which provides clinical and operational leadership to Garnet Health's emergency services division, was honored for its commitment and service during the COVID-19 era, and its early pledge of \$1 million toward the Garnet Health Foundation's Every Minute Counts campaign for the expansion of the emergency department.

Nearly 300 donors attended the event at The Barn at Villa Venezia in Middletown, N.Y., where the Foundation released its 2023 donor lists in its newsletter, Gratitude.

"These are the very best of us, committed to service to our patients and their families, and for advancing services and technology to enhance the health of the communities we serve," said Jonathan Schiller, Garnet Health president and chief executive officer. "These are truly challenging times in the hospital industry and philanthropy has become an essential revenue source to meeting the growing demands of our community."

Garnet Health Foundation Sporting Clays Tournament

The Garnet Health Foundation hosted its highly popular annual Sporting Clays Tournament on June 28, 2024, with proceeds benefiting the Every Minute Counts (EMC) campaign to renovate and expand the Garnet Health Medical Center Emergency Department.

Everyone joined in the excitement and fun at Mid-Hudson Sporting Clays in New Paltz, NY. Each shooter participated in a safety training course prior to enjoying 100 clays, shells, and lunch. Thanks to our incredible attendees and sponsors, the Sporting Clays Tournament raised over \$10,000 toward the EMC campaign.

Garnet Health Medical Center leads the region in access to state-of-the-art emergency care. The renovation of its emergency department is expected to more than double the size from 45 treatment spaces to 100, increasing capacity to 85,000 patient visits annually, and improve efficiencies while enhancing the patient experience.

"This fundraiser has quickly become one of our most anticipated events of the year, and we once again thank Mid-Hudson Sporting Clays for hosting the tournament at its beautiful Hudson Valley location," said William Dauster, CFRE, Garnet Health Foundation president and chief philanthropy officer. 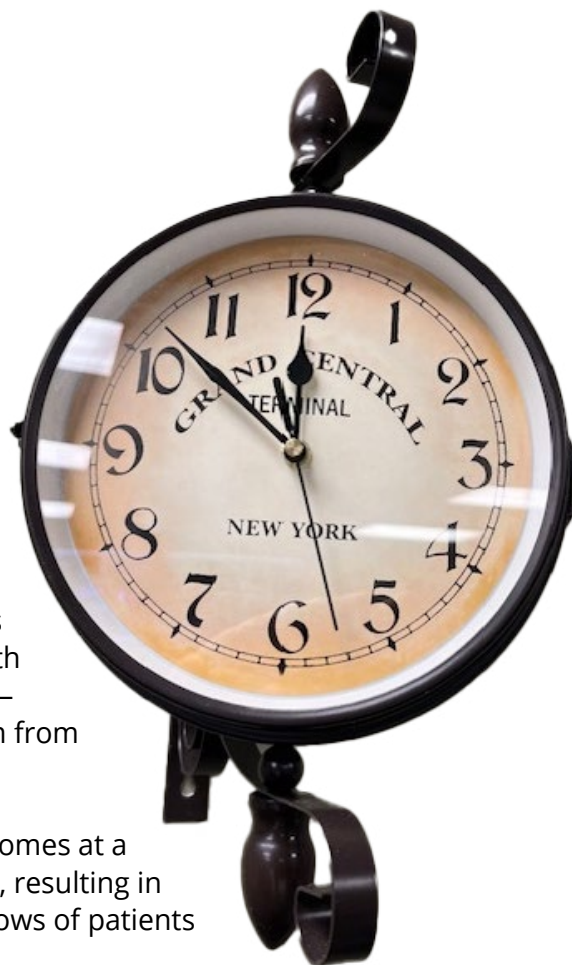
Grand Central

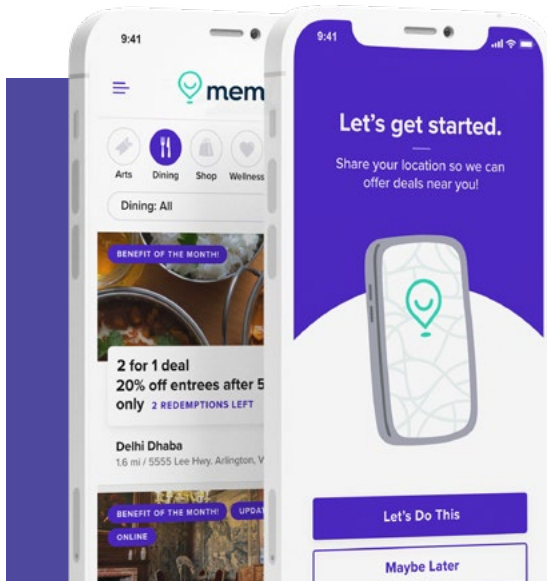
Middletown, NY now has its very own Grand Central Station!

The brand new hospital operations center, located at 707 East Main Street, is designed to better coordinate the care of Garnet Health Medical Center's inpatient services.

Justine Geisler, RN, BS, MS/MHA, administrator, clinical operations, recently took Garnet Health Foundation Board members on a tour of the new "station," where technology allows nursing management to observe, track, and redirect Garnet Health Medical Center (Middletown) and Garnet Health Medical Center — Catskills (Harris) patients as they journey through the care system from admission through discharge.

The EPIC-based system, displayed through a series of monitors, comes at a time when Garnet Health facilities have had great patient volume, resulting in pressure on their resources and causing tremendously uneven flows of patients — even creating a "bottleneck" of patients at times.





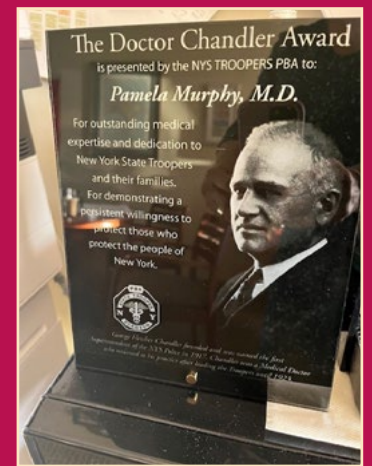
Garnet Health Foundation Member Card DISCONTINUED

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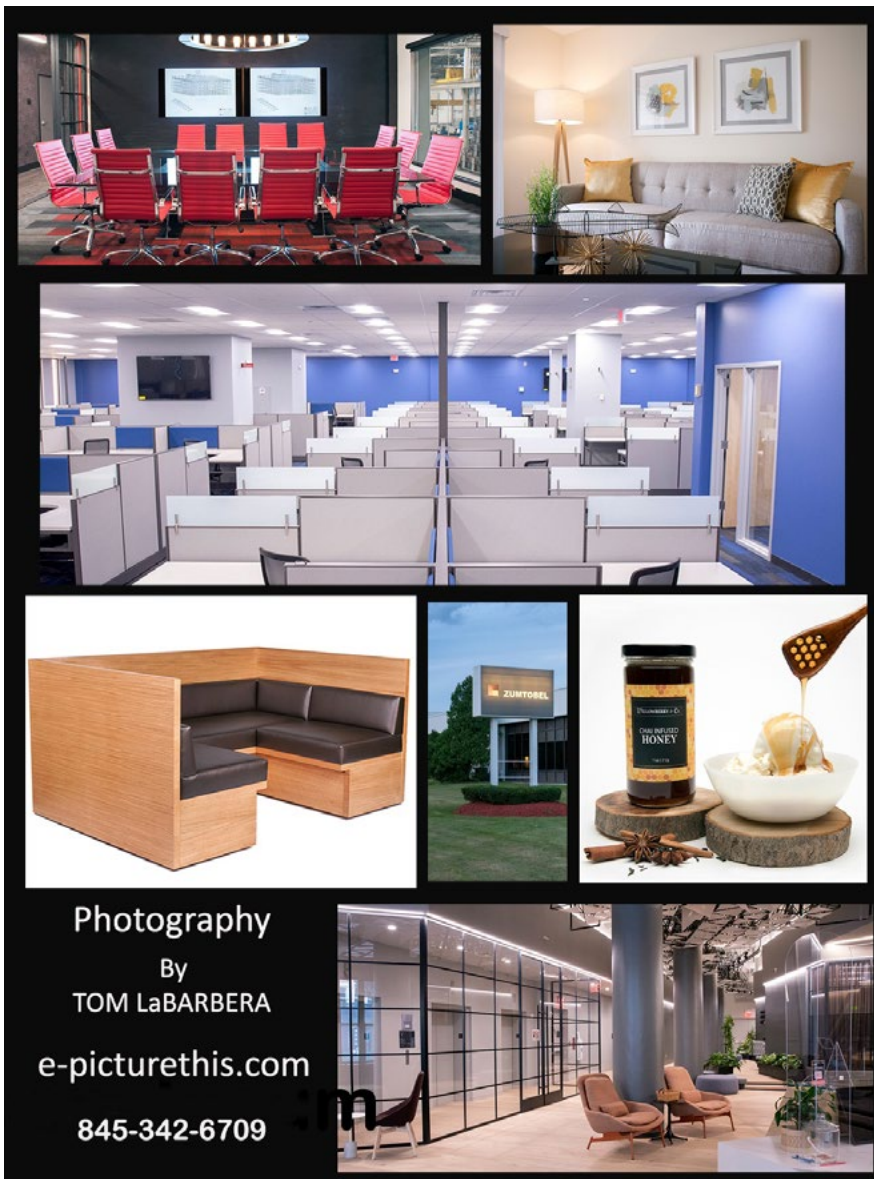
